
Picnic in the Park August 12th

The Greater Seattle ASG Picnic in the Park will be on Saturday, August 12th, from 12 pm to 4 pm at Aubrey Davis Park on Mercer Island. There will be a cake and liquid refreshments to enjoy. Bring your own lunch and any fabrics, kits or notions you wish to give away at the fabric swap. Come and share your stories and tips with your fellow sewists!

To find the picnic shelter at Aubrey Davis Park on Mercer Island:

Use your preferred method to get to Aubrey Davis Park on Mercer Island. As you approach the park, you will come to 72nd Ave SE, and cross over an overpass. As soon as you cross over, turn left into the parking lot. There is some parking under the overpass and more in the lot next to it. When you get out, head toward the overpass and walk under it. On the other side, there is a restroom on your left and a baseball field in front of you with a paved path around it. If you look across the field, you will see the picnic shelter at the far end. There are 8 small picnic tables there and a drinking fountain. As the shelter is some distance away, it will help to have a cart, wagon or other wheeled method to carry your things to it. You may also wish to bring a small table on which to place your swap items. Take either path around the baseball field to get to the shelter. There are 8 small picnic tables there and a drinking fountain.

Pamela Leggett has been teaching sewing since 1981, specializing in pattern fitting, fine garment sewing skills, knits and serging. but it was her passion and commitment to creating garments that fit and flatter real women that led her to design her first pattern in 2005. Pamela recognized that many of her students were making the same pattern adjustments to commercial patterns over and over. So, she took matters into her own hands and started creating patterns with the most common fitting adjustments already built in. The result? A better fit right out of the envelope!

But, if the pattern fits, why shapewear? Simple! Because shapewear creates a smoother, sleeker silhouette, allowing your clothes to fit better, hang better and look better! And who doesn't want to look and feel better?

Why make your own? COMFORT!! Shapewear doesn't need to squish your fluff or constrict your breathing. Making your own puts *you* in control of the control! Plus, it's easy, inexpensive and fun to sew your own.

Pamela will show you how to create three types of garments – an under bust cami (you can still wear your own bra!), high waisted undies and a slimming, control-top slip. She'll also share her secrets to sewing with stretchy lingerie fabrics, elastics and trims. You'll be sure to learn something new in this informative presentation.

Spotlight on a Member



Michelle Stoffel

Where do you now live?

I live in Stanwood, WA (North of Everett)

Where do you come from?

Born and raised Washingtonian!

When and where did you begin sewing?

I learned how to sew using a Palmer/Pletsch kid's sewing book when I was about 7 and took a few classes at a local fabric store. I learned to sew pre-YouTube, but I'm sure this would have been a valuable resource!

Did you have a mentor who taught you?

I'm mostly self-taught (other than a couple of basic classes), but my mom was (and still is) always there to help when I got stuck or didn't understand something.

Do you enter contests (regional or national)?

I've never really been much of a contest person.

Have you won any awards in the contests you have entered?

I entered an iSpy quilt in a quilt show and won the kids category when I was 9 or 10, but that is the only contest I remember entering.

What other crafts do you practice?

I'm an all-around maker—I'm always up for trying something new! Some of you are probably familiar with collecting hobbies! The ones I have most stuck with are cross-stitch, wool embroidery (Sue Spargo), quilting, bag making, cooking/baking, and gardening.

Other crafts I have tried are macrame, weaving, dyeing, knitting, crochet, scrapbooking, jewelry making...there are probably others. And crafts I'm anxious to try are shoe making, mosaic, and pottery.

What do you usually sew?

I usually sew comfy knits garments—pullovers, hoodies, tees. But I also enjoy sewing other seasonal garments that I can use as samples for work and then enjoy in my own wardrobe. Right now, I've been working on more woven tops/shirts and summer pants.

What are your favorite machines for sewing and why?

I don't know that I have a favorite machine. I've always sewed with a Pfaff, but now also have a Bernina in the mix which is quite powerful and lots of features I'm still learning. I also have a Babylock serger and coverstitch, which I love since I sew so many knits!

What tools do you like and why?

I don't use a lot of tools but I have some basic ones that are always out in my sewing area—My Kai Professional scissors, rotary cutter, pattern notcher, chaco pen, hot ruler, clip bodkin. Here is a link to my go-to favorites— https://stylemakerfabrics.com/collections/michelles-picks







What sewing techniques are you really good at?

I'm more of a Jill-of-all-trades, master of none. There is no sewing technique I'm scared to try or learn, but I wouldn't call myself a master of anything. If I had to pick my best technique, it is probably applying bias binding. I credit my years of quilting and apply all my techniques from that to garment sewing—I like how seamlessly quilters join binding ends, no bulk and the seam disappears. I also machine stitch binding in placed and ALWAYS finish it by hand.

What sewing techniques do you want to learn?

I'd like to get better at collars and plackets. It seems like I always end up with a pucker or an area where the layers don't match up quite right somewhere. I know I should learn more about fit too, but just hasn't been high on my priority list.

Do you have favorite pattern companies?

I sew almost exclusively indie patterns, I like that they have all been tested, offer lots of resources, and come from fellow small businesses. I always have good luck with anything I make from <u>Closet Core</u>

<u>Patterns</u> and <u>Named Clothing</u>. Favorites include: <u>Cielo Top</u>, <u>Carolyn Pajamas</u>, <u>Sloan Sweatshirt</u>. I have also sewed just about every bag pattern from <u>Noodlehead</u> (I highly recommend!)

I've tried patterns from just about all the designers <u>we carry at Style Maker Fabrics</u>, and have not had a bad experience with any of them!

Do you have favorite fabric sources?

I'm very fortunate that I have my own fabric store at my fingertips. I am co-owner of <u>Style Maker Fabrics</u> and shop pretty much exclusively from what we stock. Occasionally I'll order specific quilting fabric that we don't carry online, or if I'm shopping locally my go-to quilt shop is Calico Creations in Mt. Vernon.

What keeps you sewing?

I love that I haven't been clothes shopping in forever. Yes, I buy a few RTW things I don't have time to sew, but for the most part I don't buy clothes anymore. Not only is this more sustainable, I have a wardrobe of unique things that I love. I also really enjoy the act of making something and having a finished product I can wear and enjoy at the end of my efforts. And of all the "crafts" I do, being able to wear your project is the most satisfying!

Why did you join ASG?

I joined ASG to meet more fellow sewists and learn from their amazing wealth of knowledge. While I haven't met too many my age (mid-30s) or with my same self-taught fearless background, I have made some amazing sewing friends and it is always fun to learn more about what they are sewing, learning, etc.

Anything else you want to share?

There is a HUGE sewing community out there online, many of whom are here locally, and I'd love to find a way to make ASG more inviting to the "younger" crowd. Yes, we are self-taught. Yes, we don't always sew something the way it "should" be done. But that's OK! We are creating some pretty amazing garments and tackling projects many sewists would never dream of and having a blast doing it! I think we can all learn from each other and enjoy each other's company doing it!

My suggestions for the group—1) Try more indie patterns! You'll be surprised how many more resources they offer than the BIG 4. 2) Tackle a project outside of your comfort zone—sew a pair of jeans, a bag, a lined coat—teach yourself and learn something new. 3) Join the SeattleSews Facebook group—they are a very active exciting group 4) Check out the amazing sewing community on Instagram—it is a very valuable resource!
